WHAT KIT & EQUIPMENT DO I NEED?

Kit & **Equipment:**

- Each team should wear matching t-shirts and shorts. Teams should provide contrasting colour kit in case of clash. The second named team to change kit.
- Regular glasses are not permitted. Players must wear sports specific glasses e.g. soft frame with band holding/fixing glasses to player's head. If this is not in place the player will not be allowed to play with regular unsecured glasses
- No wax is allowed.
- No jewellery or any other objects which could be dangerous is permitted.
- Match ball: Size 2.
- Court Dimensions are within the England Handball Association guidelines.

SPORT SPECIFIC RULES

- 1. The Competition Director's decision on the application of the Handball and Tournament rules will be final. Failure to abide by these rules can and will result in disqualification.
- 2. Short rules to Handball can be downloaded at www.londonyouthgames.org/handball
- 3. The event will run in accordance with the rules of Handball published by the England Handball Association.
- 4. Matches:
 - a) Teams must be ready to play two minutes before scheduled start time.
 - b) The start and end of matches will be controlled by a central hooter, followed by a match referee's whistle.
 - c) In the event of an injury the appropriate amount of injury time will be played at the end of the game based on the referee's discretion.
 - d) Games will restart with a pass from the centre after a goal is scored.
 - e) Teams consist of 7 players (six outfield plus one GK). Squads can consist of up to 14 players.
 - Players are interchangeable at any time during the game. Only once the court player has stepped off the court can a substitute player step onto the field of play.
 - g) One referee is required on court and their decision is final. Two referees may be used during playoff and final matches. Any failure to abide by the referees decision can and will be met with repercussions to the team or individual involved.
- 5. INCOMPLETE COMPETITION: In the event that the competition is cancelled or suspended, the following steps will be used to calculate a final result:
 - a) The furthest completed stage of competition will be used to countback.
 - b) Any teams tied on position will be separated based on the rules above which determine group positions, using averages.
 - c) The minimum competition required to determine a result is a completed stage.
- 6. The Competition Director reserves the right to suspend/cancel the event where required by unsafe conditions.
