HOW DO I ENTER?

Competition Type: Secondary Open

How to enter: You will need to provide full details of your squad before the 'squad closed' date so each competitor can be checked and confirmed as eligible. Teams are submitted online.

About the competition

Competition Format

- Points awarded are: 3 for a win, 1 for a draw.
- Match format: Matches are 7 minutes, 7-a-side.
- In knockout stages, in a tie after normal play: 3 minutes of extra time played, if still tied each side takes 3 penalty kicks, if still level each team takes alternate kicks until a winner emerges.
- Groups decided by: points accrued, goal difference, number of goals scored, record between the two teams, sudden death penalty shoot out.

Draw Format

Round Robin groups of 4-6 teams. The winners of each group and the best runners-up (8 teams) will progress to knockout to contest quarter, semi and final 3rd / 4th play off.

Seeding

None.

Final Positions

Points allocated based on final positions and group placings – all teams achieving same group position awarded equal position.

Medals

GOLD: winner, SILVER: finalist, BRONZE: losing semi-finalists.

WHAT KIT & EQUIPMENT DO I NEED?

Kit & Equipment:

- Shin pads are compulsory.
- Permitted footwear; trainers, Astro boots or moulded plastic stud football boots. Metal studs and blades must not be worn. Players without the correct footwear will not be permitted to play.
- Jewellery should be removed or taped
- Match ball: Molten, size 5 (VG5000A)

Team Manager Notes:

- LYG reserve the right to request proof of disability (eg):-Letter from school (MLD), copy of the Childs statement of special educational needs (SEN) where primary SEN is properly assessed GENERAL (as opposed to specific e.g. dyslexia) learning disability and highlighting where this can be found in the statement. Letter of registered disability/Letter from a doctor / optician stating physical or sensory impairment.
- Eligibility: Each footballer has a physical, sensory or learning impairment and must attend either a special school, have a recognised / registered disability, or have statement of special educational needs as described below. Young people with a moderate learning disability are defined as:
 - A. Those who attend a school for moderate learning difficulties by virtue of a properly assessed GENERAL (as opposed to specific e.g. dyslexia) learning disability. And/or
 - B. Those who have a statement of special educational needs (SEN) when their primary SEN is a properly assessed GENERAL (as opposed to a specific e.g. dyslexia) learning disability and this is stated within the statement.

SPORT SPECIFIC RULES

1. The decision of the Competition Director present and their application of these rules will be final. The Competition Director reserves the right to suspend/cancel the event where required by weather/unsafe conditions.
2. This competition is a 7-a-side competition. A minimum of 5 players are required for the game to go ahead.
3. All substitutes when not playing must wear a different colour to their team when in play. Subs may only be used with referee's permission.
4. If a team is not ready to start their allocated game within 30 seconds of the referee starting the game, then 2 goals will automatically be awarded to the opposition and the game will start when the team arrives and will play for the remainder of the 7 minutes.
5. If both teams are not ready to play their allocated game within 30 seconds of the referee starting the game, the game will start as soon as both teams are ready & they will only play for the remainder of the 7 minutes
6. If a team is not able to play a game at all (e.g. they have left) then within the round robin stage a 5-0 walk-over will be given to the opposition. If this is within the knockout stage then the next team available will take their place and points.
7. Goalkeepers can only roll the ball to team members under arm.
8. Corner kicks will be taken in the normal way.
9. Sliding tackles are **NOT** permitted.

10. Any player cautioned (Yellow card) will not be allowed to participate in the following match. A second caution (2nd Yellow card), at any point in the competition, will result in the player not being allowed to take further part in the competition.

11. A player dismissed (red card) from the field of play for whatever reason will be expelled from the remainder of the competition. Foul or abusive language will be penalised by the referee at his or her discretion, by awarding a direct free kick (defend

12. If a team is going to arrive after 10.30 then they must call. If the Competition Director has not been informed of an expected late arrival by 10.30, then the team will be presumed as not attending and will be removed from the days draw.

13. Incorrect information provided during nominations can disqualify the team and cause their entire Borough team to receive penalty points.

ParaGames Specific:

P1. Any player with a prosthesis leg must have it fully covered with foam cladding.

P2. Due to safety requirements no player using any form of mobility aid, e.g. Wheelchair, walking frames or crutches, will be eligible to play.

P3. Protests (including eligibility): Any dispute during a competition should be reported to the Competition Director as soon as possible. For any action to occur this must happen prior to the completion of the final match.

INCOMPLETE COMPETITION: In the event that the competition is cancelled or suspended, the following steps will be used to calculate a final result.

a. The furthest completed stage of competition will be used to countback.

b. Any teams tied on position will be separated based on the rules above which determine group positions, using averages.

c. The minimum competition required to determine a result is a completed stage.
