Any athlete that has recorded a Personal Best on the [Power of 10](#) that exceeds the ESAA District Standard for Year 8 Boys is not eligible to compete. The Personal Best time must not have been achieved prior to 5 June 2022. If the time is posted at an event after this date, the individual will remain eligible.

COMPETITION INFORMATION

Competition Format:

- Field events – best performance.
- Track events – heats & finals (800m & 1500m run as time trials)

Draw Format:

Heats drawn at random prior to the day (and subject to any withdrawals changes)

Seeding:

None

Final Positions:

Each team is allocated points for each event (1st=33, 2nd=32 etc) and their total will decide the winning team.

Medals:

- GOLD: Winner, SILVER: 2nd place, BRONZE: 3rd place. Individual and Relay medals awarded.
- Borough trophy is awarded for the overall winner (team medals awarded).

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TEAM MANAGER INFORMATION

- Kit & Equipment:**
- Running spikes can be worn.
- Team manager notes:**
- Each borough must bring 1 helper aged 18 or over, across both competitions.
 - Team Managers will be required to complete and return a declaration form at registration.

SPORT SPECIFIC RULES

- 1) The competition will be run under UKA rules.
- 2) Each athlete is limited to one track event, one field event and one relay event.
- 3) TRACK events include:
 - 100 metres,
 - 200 metres,
 - 800 metres,
 - 1500 metres
- 4) FIELD events include:
 - High Jump (3 consecutive failures & out),
 - Long Jump (3 attempts),
 - Shot Put, 3.00kg (3 attempts),
 - Vortex Howler (3 attempts)
- 5) RELAY event includes:
 - 4x100 metres
- 6) 100m & 200m A & B Final.
 - Winner of each heat + fastest qualify to A final.
 - The next fastest 8 times qualify to B final. The points will be calculated in the positions of the finals & then placings from the 17th best downwards (those not in the final) will be calculated on time only.
 - If an athlete drops out of a final, they will be awarded points for the last place of that race (for example – 8th place in 100m)
- 7) Seeding:
 - The lane Draw for the A and B Finals in the 100m and 200m will be seeded thus: Lanes 3,4,5,6, - 4 fastest qualifying times and drawn randomly in what is known as Preferred lanes.
 - Lanes 1,2,7,8 - 4 slowest qualifying times and drawn randomly.
- 8) Time Trials only for 800m & 1500m.
- 9) In all instances, the decision of the Competition Director is final.
- 10) Incorrect information provided during nominations can disqualify the team and cause their entire Borough team to receive penalty points. Please check competitor's details.

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11) The Competition Director reserves the right to suspend/cancel the event where required by weather/unsafe conditions.

INCOMPLETE COMPETITION: In the event that the competition is cancelled or suspended, the following steps will be used to calculate a final result.

- a) Results from all completed events are combined and used to identify the overall winner.
- b) Minimum requirement: To determine a completed event all heats must be completed. To determine a result for the competition 1 event must be completed.
- c) Tied teams: will not be separated once scores from events are combined, except in the event that the top 3 teams have the same number of points then the highest number of first place event finishers will be the deciding factor, then second place event finishers and so on.
- d) Borough entry: If a borough has entered the competition but not an event that is used in the scoring calculations, they will be placed in last position.
