PEN 2.1 Should a school wish to bring a participant who falls beyond this age range, approval should be sought from LYG by emailing lucy.girling@londonyouthgames.org

PEN 2.2 It is the responsibility of teachers & SGOs to ensure all participants details are entered correctly at the time of submission, and that they are eligible to take part.

PEN 3 Eligibility Criteria

PEN 3.1 Competition Tier: Develop

RAC 3.1.1 Competition Intent: Developmental event which will focus on extending children and young people's knowledge & understanding of a particular sport using station based or non-scoring games formats. The measure of success is determined by demonstrating sporting values or through the accrual of team best scores. Local qualifying festivals may be used as a selection process to these events but is not mandatory.

PEN 4 Squad Size Schools are permitted to bring a minimum of 7 and a maximum of 15 participants.

PEN 4.1 Groups should be made up of 50/50 split between boys and girls.

PEN 5 Kit & Equipment All equipment is provided by the festival providers.

PEN 6 Format

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PEN 6.1.1 Schools will rotate throughout the stations. A timetable will be provided at registration.
